Parent-Swimmer participation contract

To ensure a high standard is kept within the Seadog Swim Team, each family must follow the guidelines below. By reviewing and signing this agreement, each family has read, understands and agrees to the requirements for participation.

Parents

Waiver/Release – As a parent and/or guardian of the child/children listed on the registration form. I voluntarily release and agree to not hold Shelbyville Country Club, its agents including but not limited to the Seadog Swim Team, any of the teams coaches or club members as individuals for any injuries and/or losses that may occur during my child/children's participation with the Seadogs Swim Team. I knowingly and voluntarily assume all risks of injury and loss, whether known or unknown, of all swimming events and all other Seadog activities. I also understand that SCC Seadogs doesn't carry medical insurance for swim team members. As a parent or legal guardian, I understand that SCC Seadogs are a private swim team. I agree to follow all the rules and regulations of the Shelbyville Country Club.

Volunteering – Unlike other youth sports, swim meets are labor intensive. A large number of parent volunteers are needed to conduct a successful swim meet and without parent volunteers there can be no swim meet. Each team is responsible for staffing their home meets with timers, stroke judges, runners, scoring officials, age group parents, etc. A parent is required to assist the swim team by volunteering at home and away meets. If you choose not to volunteer, a \$100 fine will be assessed (as noted on the registration form).

Photographs – I will permit Shelbyville Country Club Seadogs to use photographs of the swimmer and my family on our private Facebook page and the SCC Website.

Perspective – As the season progresses, swimmers and parents get more involved with performance at the swim meets. Please try to maintain a healthy emotional detachment that allows your swimmer to participate to the best of their ability. Please resist the temptation to coach your child. Please leave the coaching to our qualified coaching staff.

Communication – Parents are expected to communicate with coaches and the SCC swim team board regarding absences from meets. This is crucial so that your swimmer is not slotted to swim in meets that they will not be attending. This can have an effect on the team. Any questions and/or concerns you have, we ask that you handle in an adult manner with the coaches. If at any time you don't feel there is resolution, please engage the swim team board for assistance.

Storms – Please be aware that where there is thunder and/or lightning, practice and/or meets will stop temporarily. The practice or meet will resume within 30 minutes of the thunder/lightning. If bad weather persists, the meet may be cancelled or rescheduled for another day. Please do not leave until the practice or meet has been officially cancelled. If a decision is made to cancel prior to a practice or meet, correspondence will be emailed or posted to our Facebook page. While we try to make a decision in advance, sometimes it is not possible to make a firm decision prior.

Swimmer Team Area – During meets (home and away), swimmers must stay in the designated area. When swimmers are not able to be located, they may miss an event. Swimmers 10 and under will have age group parents that will be assisting with lining them up for their events. Parents, please speak with your young swimmers about staying in their designated team area. If this continues to be a problem for certain swimmers we will then make it the parents' responsibility to have their child to events.

Swim Team Suits – A team suit is not required. However, the Seadogs are changing the team suits for the 2021 season. If you have a past suit that stills fits, you are absolutely permitted to wear that suit. Our new suit will be available at Swimville. If you choose not to purchase the team suit, a solid navy suit can be worn (for both girls and boys). You will also be provided a SCC swim cap. All swimmers are encouraged to wear the provided swim cap. Additional swim caps will be available for purchase from the swim board if needed.

Swimmers

Sportsmanship – Good sportsmanship is a hallmark of the Seadog swim team. We pride ourselves on the quality of our swimmers and the sportsmanship they demonstrate. Swimmers are expected to be respectful of fellow teammates and competitors. At home meets, swimmers are expected to be good hosts and welcoming visiting teams. At away meets, swimmers are expected to be mindful that we are guests and need to follow the rules as well as keep our team area clean.

Respect for Others – Any swimmer who disrupts practice will be asked to leave. Disruptive behavior includes but is not limited to:

- Failure to follow a coaches request
- Splashing, dunking, pushing, pulling of other swimmers
- Any action that stops the flow of the workout
- Disrespect to fellow teammates or coaches
- Horseplay, bullying or verbal abuse

Respects for Property – Swimmers are expected to respect the SCC pool and property, as well as all properties that host away meets. This includes the pool, pool area, restrooms, and personal belongings of swimmers. Any swimmer who vandalizes property will be removed from the team for the remainder of the season. The swimmer will be responsible for restitution.

Disciplinary Action – In the event there is a disciplinary problem, the steps for handling will be as follows: The coach will discuss the problem with the swimmer and make every effort to resolve the problem. If the offense is repeated, the parents, coaches and the SCC swim team board will be notified to determine the appropriate actions.

Practice Attendance – During the regular season, swimmers are requested to attend practice at least twice per week. If you are not able to attend practice or meets, coaches need to be notified as soon as possible. Swimmers are

requested to arrive 10 minutes prior to their practice time and be changed and ready to swim. Swimmers are expected to practice in appropriate attire (suits, goggles, caps, etc). When practice is concluded, swimmers are expected to assist with storing equipment.
